### Attendance:

whilst Nursery School education is not compulsory, if you have accepted a place for your child, it is expected that the funding given to us by the Government is used for the education of your child. Therefore it is expected that your child attends Nursery every day. We appreciate that there will be occasions where your child is too poorly to attend, but the expectation across the year is an attendance figure of 95%. Our current average is only 71%. Please help us increase that figure by ensuring your child attends every day.

It is also extremely important that we are notified of any absences. This can be either by telephone (01753 978660), or by email (office@chalveyeyc.slough.sch.uk). If we don't hear from you with regards to your child's absence, and we're unable to get you on the phone, we may need to instigate our 'Missing Child' procedure, which involves coming to your home, and further to that, reporting your child as missing to the Police.

### **Punctuality:**

Please make every effort to arrive on time for the start of each session. Gates shut at 8.45am and 12.45pm. By arriving late your child misses valuable teaching time and you will have to wait until the introduction session has finished before your child can be admitted as a late arrival.
